**Worship Committee**

The Worship Committee plans and organizes Special Liturgies for Seasons and Holydays. They care for the Environment of the Church with flowers and decorations. They work on all Spiritual aspects of the Worship of the Parish.

**Education Committee**

The Education Committee oversees and plans all of the educational activities of the Parish.

**Choir**

The choir is open to all who may wish to participate. We currently have three different choirs: The Adult Choir, The Resurrection Choir, and the Contemporary Choir. Practice is on Thursday evenings from September through June.

**CCD Volunteer**

Our CCD program meets on Sundays from 10:00-11:20 AM from September through May. Volunteers are needed as teachers and as teaching assistants.

**Christian Mothers and Women's Guild**

The Christian Mothers are responsible for various spiritual duties of the Parish. They work together to help the Parish financially with their special events, such as working at the festivals and having money-raising events. The ladies meet on the first Wednesday of the month for refreshments and fellowship. Refreshments begin at noon and the meeting begins at 12:30 PM.

**CCD Special Education**

The main purpose of the CCD Special Ed program is to spiritually educate and prepare the mentally and physically disabled for the reception of the sacraments. Every day living skills are also taught to these group of individuals. The group meets on Saturday mornings from 10:00-11:00 AM from October to May. Volunteers are always needed.

**St. Vincent de Paul Society**

This group of volunteers help needy families of all denominations. This society exists on donations from our Parishioners. Baskets are placed before the altar on the first Sunday of each month to collect non-perishable food, paper products, cleaning materials, and monetary donations. The items are then distributed to the needy by dedicated men of this society.

**Golden Age Group**

Our Golden Age Group welcomes anyone 55 years or older to join. They meet in the School Hall on the last Wednesday of each month at 12:30 PM.

**Ushers**

This group of men see to it that there is order at all church functions. They make sure that everyone is seated at Mass and maintain order at Communion and take up the Offertory Collections.

**St. Anthony Lyceum**

The object of the Lyceum is to provide healthy amusement and to serve as a bond of union for the preservation of faith and morals. The men of the Lyceum participate in all Parish functions and hold annual fund raisers for the good of the Parish. The Lyceum members also support the work of the Special Education Program through monthly donations. Join these men for a card game, golf, or just good fellowship. The club is located in the Convent basement. All males age 16 and older are invited to join.

**Lector**

The Lectors are the readers of the Sacred Scriptures for the liturgies and functions. This is an important role for these people who give of their time and talents to do God's work.

**Eucharistic Minister**

The Eucharistic Ministers duty is to assist at the Masses. They may either help with the distribution of the Sacred Host or the Cup. Some of these dedicated people take the Eucharist each Sunday to shut-ins so they may feel a part of the congregation through the reception of Christ's Body and Blood.

**St. Anthony Chapel Volunteer**

The Chapel is run by this group of dedicated volunteers. Volunteers are needed as sitters during its open hours, and also to be tour guides for the large number of tours scheduled.

**Bereavement Committee**

This group of volunteers see to it that all needs during a funeral are met. They visit the funeral home, attend funeral Masses, and anything else that needs to be arranged.

**Festival Volunteer**

Dozens of volunteers are called upon each year to plan, organize and work our two biggest events: our Annual Summer Festival, and our Annual Oktoberfest. Without the help of these volunteers, the festivals would not be a success.

**Church Cleaner**

This group of volunteers meet every Thursday morning after Mass to clean our Church.

**Food Preparer**

This group of volunteers are vital to our festival dinners. We could always use more hands in the kitchen.

**Phone Call Volunteer**

Occasionally we need people to make phone calls for various reasons.

**Youth Group Volunteer**

Chaperones are needed throughout the year to help monitor our events for youth.
